

WildExodus Itinerary

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Typical Itinerary for Glamping Adventures:

Itineraries can be customized and developed based on group size, ages, interests, timing, etc.

Day 1:

Arrive at Wawaitin Holiday Park 1:00PM. Meet your host and guide, welcome refreshments, orientation and registration, wilderness safety, a two-hour tour of Kenogamissi Lake, and overnight stay at a Mattagami Yurt.

Day 2:

After a morning meal your guide will take you to the city with a heart of gold for a tour of the Shania Twain Center highlighting the accomplishments of a world renowned native country singer. You can also try panning for gold at the famous Hollinger mine. A drive and short paddle out to the glamping site set up on the banks of an Arctic water shed river. This will be your first night sleeping under the stars of the Boreal Forest.

Day 3:

Visit the nearby rapids and waterfalls before trekking on to today's paddle adventure. Search for a soaring eagle or a loons teaching their young to catch fish – try catching your own using eco-friendly biodegradable baits. The evening will be spent at the camp fire, tall tales, and chance to experience the sounds of true nature! Look up, the Borealis may show itself.

Day 4:

Your Boreal Forest experience will continue with lots of choices from a vast menu of activities. However, this morning mother nature is watering its garden so its time to sip on some lovely tea and lounge with a good book. This evening will be perfect to practice the 'call of the wild' and learn to howl as wolves or call out a moose with the help your a wilderness guide.

Day 5:

Today you are joined by a Boreal Forest Guru who will take you on a great Canadian beaver hunt. From a canoe you will search out a water impoundment created by a busy beaver family who will offer you the opportunity to capture exceptional footage of them at work and play. Well admired world-wide, the beaver is a great symbol of Canadian pioneering fortitude and self-reliance. Certainly there will be other wildlife.

Day 6:

After watching the sunrise and photographing a moose while angling, trek into the woods in search of edibles and more wildlife. A black bear is observed gorging on blueberries as you pick mushrooms nearby. Relax to a glass of wine and watch the amazing otter crack open clams on the river bank as your morning's fresh catch and afternoon harvest are prepared for diner. A surprise appearance by a local folk artist usually happens...

Day 7:

Now that you have rekindled your kinship with mother nature, your guide will bring you back to Wawaitin Holiday Park where your host will provide farewell refreshments and brunch before your trip home. Wait, if you have time, you can visit Cedar Meadows Wilderness Park.
